WHAT'S NEW AT SSA FOR 2021?

SSA increased the <u>Substantial Gainful Activity (SGA)</u> amount for individuals with disabilities, other than blindness, from \$1,260/mo. to <u>\$1,310/mo.</u> for 2021. They increased the SGA amount for individuals who are blind from \$2,110/mo. to **\$2,190/mo.** for 2021.

SSA increased the monthly earnings amount that they use to determine if a month counts for the <u>**Trial Work Period (TWP)**</u> from \$910/mo. to <u>\$940/mo.</u> for 2021.

For 2021, SSA increased the <u>Supplemental Security Income</u> (SSI) Federal Benefit Rates (FBR) from \$783/mo. to <u>\$794/mo.</u> for an eligible individual and from \$1,175/mo. to <u>\$1,191/mo.</u> for an eligible couple.

For 2021, SSA increased amounts for the <u>Student Earned-</u> <u>Income Exclusion</u>. The monthly amount was increased from \$1,900 to <u>\$1,930</u> and the yearly maximum from \$7,670 to <u>\$7,770</u>.

For 2021, the <u>Kentucky state threshold</u> for <u>Medicaid while</u> <u>working – 1619(b)</u> is <u>\$32,062/yr</u>.
